Overview

Research associate professor in psychiatric epidemiology. Research experience on perinatal epidemiology and early health risk factors in relation to schizophrenia. Also experience within general mental health epidemiology, alcohol-research & register-based research. Collaborations with others include suicidology, comorbidity, treatment-resistant schizophrenia, high-risk research and the genetics of schizophrenia sub-phenotypes.

Biography

Holger graduated as a medical doctor from University of Copenhagen in 1986 and acquired a Ph.D in 1999 (Premorbid IQ in schizophrenia based on an aggregate of two Danish longitudinal high-risk studies: The Copenhagen High Risk Study and the Copenhagen Perinatal Cohort). Since 2000, specialist in psychiatry with broad clinical-psychiatric experience as chief physician at some of the major mental health institutions in Denmark.

The Phenotypes in Alcohol Use Disorder (PAUSE) project.
